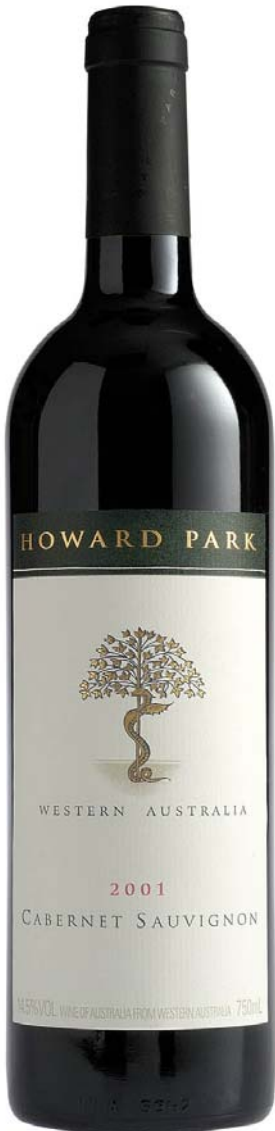

GOLD – INTERNATIONAL WINE CHALLENGE



Howard Park's 2001 Cabernet Sauvignon has been awarded a **Gold** medal at the 2005 International Wine Challenge in London.

The International Wine Challenge is the world's largest blind tasting event held annually in London. It compares over 9000 wines from all over the world.

The 2001 Howard Park Cabernet Sauvignon was **one of only two West Australian Cabernet's** to be awarded a Gold medal in the 2005 competition.

This award is proudly added to a growing list of accolades for our flagship 2001 Cabernet:

- **Blue Gold Medal: 2004 Sydney International Wine Competition**

- *Robert Parker Jnr: 90 Points, 2003*

"We are extremely proud to receive such a strong accolade for our Cabernet Sauvignon, this wine is crafted with an uncompromising vision and to receive a gold medal on an International stage against intense competition affirms our belief in the two premier wine regions of Western Australia." said Winemaker Michael Kerrigan.
