### 2024 HOWARD PARK ALLINGHAM CHARDONNAY

“A warmer vintage yet this comes across as cool, cooling and refined; still plenty of flavour though. Lemon and white peach, nougat studded with grilled nuts. Creamy, with a touch of honeycomb. The oak imparts flavour, for sure, but it is neatly integrated. The acidity is refreshing and drives this to a long finish, with just the right amount of phenolics to add more shape and depth. Very classy drink here, folks.”

### 2023 HOWARD PARK ABERCROMBIE CABERNET SAUVIGNON

“Ideally, you’d pop this away for a year or so to shake off the rawness of youth and build complexity. Foundations are good though: cedary oak infusing the mulberries and cassis, fruit compote doused in woody spices, with some cooling menthol, too. Fuller bodied, with persuasive tannins and refreshing acidity. To see it at its best today, match to hearty fare.”

### 2023 HOWARD PARK A.S.W CABERNET SAUVIGNON SHIRAZ

“Pristine fruit comes out, delicately spiced, with plenty of savoury inputs in nori, tapenade and ironstone. For such a youthful red, this is vibrant but also composed, the tannins exceptional. The length lingers, while tempting to drink this now, more time in bottle will add more complexity.”

### 2022 HOWARD PARK SCOTSDALE CABERNET SAUVIGNON

“This charms immediately with its heady aromas, following through with poised flavours and such an even palate. Nothing overt, just blackberries and cassis, cedary, spicy oak and inky/stony nuances with a juiciness and suppleness across the more mid-weighted palate. Lovely fine tannins and acidity in tow. It feels unforced, almost gentle. Ready now but will develop more detail with age.”

### 2023 HOWARD PARK LESTON CABERNET SAUVIGNON

“Overall, there’s seems to be more restraint with the reds from ‘23, a lovely cooler vintage, although this still gets 25% new oak and was aged 18 months. Yet the fruit has taken it all in. Plenty of varietal charm, the fine, powdery tannins and tangy acidity adding to the succulence across the fuller-bodied palate before a fresh, dry finish.”

### 2018 HOWARD PARK MUSEUM RELEASE RIESLING

“A mid-straw gold. While still youthful and vibrant, there’s some aged complexity of toasty aromas with lime curd and baked ricotta flavours. A little ginger cream, too. It’s still wound up with acidity and that means this will continue to age gracefully, but hard to resist now.”

### 2024 HOWARD PARK MIAMUP ROSÉ

“This is my kind of rosé – a pastel-pink hue, crisp, dry and super refreshing. Plenty of red fruit accents, some watermelon too, tangy, tart and juicy, so the tastebuds get a good workout. It’s a little savoury, a little spicy, with plenty to enjoy.”

### NV HOWARD PARK JETÉ ROSÉ

“It’s an attractive coppery pink; fragrant with lemon blossom and roses, toasted brioche and lime curd. The palate is tight, citrusy yet with hints of red fruits, too, shortcake and a lovely creaminess, all cinched tightly with bright acidity. Very good.”

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### 2019 HOWARD PARK MUSEUM RELEASE RIESLING

“A soft and succulent riesling that leans into its maturity, showing off honeyed elements, toasty notes, dried fruits and sweet spices amongst the last vestiges of freshness in green apple and grapefruity tang. There’s a pleasing, assured riesling here, gloss and richness ably lifted with vitality. It is drinking in a good spot now.”

### 2023 HOWARD PARK FLINT ROCK SHIRAZ

“Intense dark-red hue, and intense flavours, too. Loads of brown spices, some pepper and mace infuse the black plums, squid ink and ferrous. Full bodied and rich, but what’s pleasing, it’s not weighty or heavy – the palate is supple as the tannins are plump and soft, then the acidity keeps everything on track. Good drink in anyone’s book”

### 2019 HOWARD PARK GRAND VINTAGE JETÉ

“Comes together harmoniously with the best batches of pinot noir and chardonnay...Mid-straw gold hue with plenty of fine bead and toasty, lemony aromas. Super dry and refreshing flavours range from buttered toast, apple crumble, yeasty/autolysis goodness, all creamy with honeycomb, and some salted lemons. This enjoys a degree of complexity and detail befitting the Grand Vintage style and it doesn’t disappoint.”

### 2023 HOWARD PARK MIAMUP CABERNET SAUVIGNON

“Incredibly vibrant and fresh and oh-so highly drinkable. Everything dialled back, just a light combo of cassis and blackberries, woody spices, black olives and nori with pops of sweet fruit across the fuller-bodied palate. Raspberry-sorbet acidity and fine, lightly drying tannins caressing the palate. Punches above its weight.”

### 2024 HOWARD PARK GREAT SOUTHERN RIESLING

“There’s an openness to the ’24 rieslings – the acidity feels different, soft and textural, although this does have energy and drive. Heady aromas of lemon blossom and fresh herbs; it’s a little tangy and juicy with makrut lime, lemon rind and a zinc-like quality to the acidity. Drinking well now and will be even better in a few years.”

### NV HOWARD PARK JETÉ PREMIER BRUT

“Already showing some tertiary characters alongside secondary flavours of creamed honey, almond pastries, salted lemons and a smidge of oak spice. It is fresh, though, with plenty of brisk acidity cutting its way through the flavours, then finishing crisp and dry.”

### NV HOWARD PARK PETIT JETÉ

“Mid-straw yellow; good bead, with wafts of just-baked lemon shortbread and white peach with the merest hint of woody spices. The palate is tightly wound by acidity, very dry yet refreshing, quite intense, yet there’s some complexity and precision.”

### 2024 HOWARD PARK FLINT ROCK RIESLING

“There’s a softness and immediate appeal here with dabs of lemon and lime, some lemon curd, too, adding a layer of texture. It’s quite restrained with almost soft acidity, although the finish is crisp and fresh. It’s delicate and pleasing.”
